

BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS FOR STUDENTS

Adventist National School adheres to strong ethical and moral principles. We believe that following rules and expectations ensures the well-being and protection of all of our students and school community. For this reason, we expect every student to follow these rules:

- Come to school on time and ready to start school (missing school for more than 19 days will result in repeating the school year.)
- Be ready to learn and in the classroom at the beginning of each class. Bring school materials and books as required.
- Do not leave the school grounds without permission from the principal's office. Also, do not leave class without permission from the teacher.
- Pay attention and follow instructions. Cooperate with directions and requests given by school staff. Do not disrupt learning for self or others.
- Refrain from lying, cheating, or stealing.
- Wear the uniform every day and when allowed to dress differently, do not wear revealing clothing or clothing with bad words, gang images, weapons, skulls, etc.
- Show respect to teachers, staff, and fellow students.
- Resolve conflicts peacefully and avoid fighting inside or outside the school.
- Do not touch others inappropriately or make inappropriate body contact (no hitting, punching, kicking, slapping, biting, etc.)
- Use proper, kind language without threatening, insulting, shouting, or cursing others or using inappropriate signs or gestures.
- Take responsibility for their belongings and respect other people's and school's property (students will be required to pay for repairs or replacement costs in case of damaging/breaking school's property.)
- Do not bring inappropriate magazines or images, weapons, alcohol, lighters, or explosive devices, cigarettes, drugs or illegal substances to school. Also, do not smoke in school or near the school.
- Use cell-phones only for emergencies and after seeking permission from a staff member (cellphones may be confiscated if used inappropriately.)
- Share with school officials information that might affect the health, safety, or welfare of the school community.
- Share with parents information sent home from the school.

Not following school rules and regulations may result in verbal or written warnings, parent contact, behavior notice reports to parents, school suspension, or expulsion for severe cases.
